The Finance and Administrative Council members of the Trinity United Methodist Church met on Thursday, April 19, 2018, 6:00 p.m., CMC. Members present: Pastor Peggy Hanson, Gary Linn, David Vardiman, Debbie Vardiman, Vickie Hauge, Syd DeVries, Brian Hanson, Sue Holloway and Lynn Larsen.

Gary Linn called the meeting to order and opened with a devotion and prayer.

A change was made to the meeting agenda moving the Missions report after the approval of the minutes.

David Vardiman moved and Syd DeVries seconded to approve the **April 15, 2016 minutes. Motion carried.**

Sue Holloway reported she will be going to Swaziland and South Africa in August to take medical supplies to those areas. She would like to have a bake sale for the trip and asked for a time she could do this. It was a consensus by the council to hold the bake sale on Sunday, June 10, 2018. Sue also informed the group that 2-3 teen challenge kids from Canada along with supervisors will be coming during Biker Week. She requested permission for the teen kids to volunteer to serve during the Biker Breakfast. Sue also asked that the teen kids be able to use the front room of the CMC to visit with anyone who wants to talk to them about their experiences. Gary Linn moved and Syd DeVries seconded to **allow the teen challenge kids to volunteer their services during Biker Week and to establish times with other local organizations who also want to volunteer during Biker Week.** Eight members voted aye and one member voted nay. **Motion carried.**

David Vardiman reviewed the financial accounts and UBS accounts. He wanted to note in the minutes that the Capital Outlay Improvement Investment Funds cash available is \$2,700.00 and the Operating Investment Accounts cash available is \$6,900.00. Discussion was held on the Capital improvement projects list and what the priorities are in spending the Capital Outlay funds. David noted that we need to be very judicious in our spending and in the decisions that we make. Debbie Vardiman moved and Vickie Hauge seconded to **approve the Financial Statements** as presented. **Motion carried.**

Pastor Peggy gave her report to the Administrative Council. The Youth Report info included camps, fundraising for Mission Trip and beyond, Post Prom breakfast, joint youth group, Baccalaureate and Senior recognition, potluck/group game night, youth nights at church. The projection report included quotes, finances, pros and cons of purchasing a Projection system. Pastor Peggy discussed with the Council the need to do an Outreach mission for visitors to Trinity UMC. This outreach includes advertising, sign-in sheets, and purchasing pens/mugs to hand out to visitors. David Vardiman moved and Brian Hanson seconded to **allocate \$1,100.00 to be taken out of the Biker Breakfast Fund to go towards the cost of the Outreach Mission projects** as presented by Pastor Peggy. Seven members voted aye and one member voted nay. **Motion carried.** Updated information on Journal Renewal was presented by Pastor Peggy. We need to submit paper work to the conference. Break Through Prayer Ministry meeting will be held on April 22, the Consultation Week-end will be held May 5-6 with potluck on the 6th. A training will follow eating. We will receive and share the prescriptions from the conference on May 13. The Town Hall meetings will be held on Sunday, May 20 at 10:30 a.m., Tuesday, May 22 at 5:30 p.m. and Saturday, June 2 at 9:30 a.m. Pastor Peggy will be getting out more information in the Newsletter. Other items she reported to the Ad Council are having a new members class, congregational care calls, Lead-Deadwood Ministerial events, Annual Conference, camps, Vacation Bible School and Leadership Training Camp.

Debbie Vardiman, Education Chair, reported May 16th is the last Wisdom Wednesday class. Twenty-four volunteers are needed for Vacation Bible School.

Vickie Hauge, UMW President, noted they will be serving a luncheon this Saturday to Delta Kappa Gamma. Spring Focus is being held this Saturday in Sturgis. The next UMW meeting will be held on Thursday, May 3rd.

There was no further Old Business or New Business to come before the meeting.

The next meeting of the Finance/Administrative Council will be held Thursday, May 17, 2018, 6:00 p.m., CMC. Pastor Peggy led the group in the Break Through Prayer.

TUMC April 2018 Finance Committee Newsletter

The Finance Committee voted to fund the recommendations from the Outreach Committee with \$1,100 from Biker Breakfast funds. In other business, the TUMC Endowment CD 183138 has been rolled over into a 12 month CD at a rate of 0.75%.

All April 2018 church expenses are forecast to be paid in full by the end of the month with no anticipated outstanding liabilities remaining. The projected end-of-month (April) available undesignated cash balance is forecast in the amount of \$707, **(REVISED to \$2,541)**.

Journey Renewal Partnership Updates:

Friends, it's been almost a year since we voted to enter into the Journey Renewal Partnership. We've been to trainings, and had to a deep look into our past to understand where we have come from, to help discern and shape how we feel God is leading us into the future. Please continue to pray for the Journey Renewal Partnership.

Consultation Weekend – May 5-6

Saturday's Schedule – The consultation team will arrive around 11:00 a.m. and meet

with myself and get a tour of the church. They will have one-on-one meetings in the afternoon with leadership of the church, and then following dinner they will host a focus group of about 10-20 people.

Sunday's Schedule – We will have worship at 9 a.m. with special guest preacher Rev. Rebecca Grinager Trefz, Director of Ministries for the Dakotas Conference. Following worship we will have a **potluck**, so please bring your favorite dishes to share! After the potluck we will have our meeting/training. The more people that can attend this, the better! It will focus on what it means to start a new life cycle in the church, what this could look like, and invite us to dream together, not just for the next 5 years, but for the next 50 years and beyond! The training will last until about 1 p.m.

Prescriptions and Town Hall Meetings:

About a week following our consultation, we will receive our prescriptions. They will be shared with the congregation, in print, via e-mail, and announced. Once we receive our prescriptions we will host **three** town hall meetings. These meetings are open to everyone, and the purpose of them is to discuss the prescriptions, so that we are able to make the best educated vote. The town hall meetings are:

Saturday, June 2 at 10:00 a.m. in the CMC conference room

Vote:

On Sunday, June 3, following worship – before going to fellowship, we will vote on our prescriptions. It is a straight yes or no vote. You must be present on that day to vote. This vote will decide if we accept or decline the presented prescriptions as a whole. Meaning, we will not vote on each individual prescription. It's an all or none vote.

We have two programs in the Cupboard. One is a Commodity program thru WSDCA in Rapid City that requires income eligibility. The second is a free food pantry that anyone can use with proof of address and ID. Commodity programs require ID, SS #'s for all in the household and proof of income (if they have any) and address.

We also have an extra food box program thru WSDCA in Rapid City for Seniors 60 and over who are income qualified and are on our roll. WSDCA also sponsors a Youth Rec program which is \$25 per year for a Boys and Girls Club membership and school supplies for income qualified families who are signed up with The Lord's Cupboard.

Families (1 or more in household) may come in once a month.
