



From Pastor Jason's Desk

Greetings Friends,

I am not sure where our summer has gone, but I realize that we are now approaching August and before we know it we will be looking at having the children return to school for another year. I hope and pray that all of you have planned a time to get out in nature before summer is gone.

Do all of us know what we have as far as God given gifts and talents? If we do know what those are, we should be using them to our full capacity to create a change in our community and in our families to make them God centered and more God focused.

As Christians we are called to lead a disciplined lifestyle, if I have lost you, we will be covering this in more detail this fall in a sermon series about spiritual disciplines. What we as a church need to understand is that no one person can do this on their own. We need to band together to be a church of love and a unified body focused on one mission and one mission only. Setting aside our differences and our own personal agendas for the good of all people so that our community reflects the love, and the compassion, and the grace of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. I am not asking any one of you to do this on your own, rather join me and let's work on our own transformation and at the same time tackle the common goal of a transformed community of believers that are on a mission to win one soul for Jesus, one person at a time.

I leave you with this challenge. What is it that you enjoy doing? What is it that you are good at? Where can you use these interests in the life of the church? How can we bless just one person this week and three or four over this next month? We have all kinds of things that are going to being at the church this fall. Now is the time for you to be thinking about the difference you can make in the life of a person that you can walk beside and support, love, offer compassion to. Who is it? What name just came to you? Call them and go see them. I encourage all of us to live into the calling of Jesus Christ and be the best disciples we can be.

Administrative Council/Finance Meeting Thursday, July 20, 2023

The Trinity United Methodist Church Administrative Council meeting was held on Thursday, July 20, 2023, CMC, 5:30 p.m. Members present: Pastor Jason Christensen, Bob McNeill, Cindy McNeill, Jim Wolff, Sue Holloway, Cheryl Wolff, and Lynn Larsen.

In the absence of Gary Linn at the meeting Sue Holloway called the meeting to order and opened the meeting with devotion and prayer.

Cheryl Wolff moved/Cindy McNeill seconded to **approve the May 15, 2023 minutes** with the change of the WIF picnic on August 4 from the Lead City Park to the CMC. **Motion carried.**

There were no changes to the agenda.

Jim Wolff reviewed the Financial Report with the Council. Cindy McNeill moved/ Bob McNeill seconded to **approve the** Financial Report as presented. Motion carried. Jim was happy to report that over all our investments have grown and our member giving to the church is up. Jim informed the Council that

Jim Wefso and Sue Holloway prepared the annual Audit Report and they found the Audit to be complete and recommended that the Administrative Council accept the Audit as written. With Jim Wefso's recommendation to accept the Audit and seconded by Cheryl Wolff the **2023 Audit Report was approved by the Council**.

Bob McNeill, Trustees Chair, reported to the Council there are still some projects, especially at the parsonage, on the list that have not been completed yet. MDU has been doing work in the CMC parking lot. There was a minor accident when MDU put a hole in the wall on the outside of the CMC under Pastor Jason's office window and that will be fixed. Patch work is being done in the parking lot and the striping will get a new paint job. Pete and Jacque Fuller donated to the church a part of their land and it will be used as a Memorial Garden.

Pastor Jason reported to the council he has had two memorial services. The SPPRC committee and he have submitted the church's annual church and pastor assessment. He has started working on the Practical Church leadership courses and will be working on these courses through next July. Vacation Bible School wrapped up this week. A decision has been made on an Advent study and the date for the Live Nativity has been set.

Sue Holloway stated 1,000 Christmas cards will be sent to Adopt-A-Platoon this year. Four women from Canada will be attending Biker Breakfast. While their husbands will be helping with the breakfast the women will be doing their mission project by working on the Christmas cards and hopefully they will complete 500 of those cards. Sue shared with the council a card she received from a mother whose daughter receives these cards and both are thankful for this ministry. Clothe-A-Kid has 97 students registered (50 families) to receive help from Clothe-A-Kid in August. She still needs volunteers for Meals on Wheels.

Cindy McNeill, Staff Pastor Parish chair, informed the Council Norma, our administrative assistant, will be having knee surgery this coming week. Holly will be covering her work.

Sue Holloway reported on August 4 the Women in Faith will gather to work on the cards we will be sending to Adopt-A-Platoon for August. After working on the cards, the women will hold their annual picnic in the CMC.

Pastor Jason gave an update on the youth. He has met with Micole Davis and Cindy Specht, youth leaders. With only a couple of youth who may attend youth group this year, the church will not be holding a youth group for this upcoming year. The greenery fundraiser the youth have done for the past few years will be done by the high school Honor Society kids. Once we build up the numbers of youth in our church we will go back to selling the greenery.

Sue gave an update on Biker Breakfast. The food has been ordered, sign-up sheets to help are available, and posters will be distributed to many venues in Lead, Deadwood, Spearfish and Sturgis. The cost for the pancake breakfast is \$10 and \$12 for gluten free pancakes.

Pastor Jason informed the council Lynn Larsen will "retire" as the administrative council recording secretary at the end of 2023. He noted they will begin the process to appoint a new administrative council secretary.

The next Administrative Council meeting will be held on Thursday, August 24, 2023, 5:30 p.m., CMC. Pastor Jason closed the meeting in prayer. Lynn Larsen, Recording Secretary

Soon, they sent two women to India, one an educator and the other a doctor. The institutions they began, Isabella Thoburn College and a women's hospital, are still in existence today.

Trinity United Methodist Church partnered with churches from the Lead/Deadwood area to provide the community vacation bible school. VBS was held at the Lead park on the evenings of July 17th through July 20th. This fun ministry was able to touch the lives of around 50 children and 20 volunteers.

The VBS theme was "Stellar, Shine Jesus' Light". The VBS program had a variety of stations and activities for the children to participate in. They started by gathering at the Sing and Play Blast Off station for music and dance. The kids then rotated between other stations, such as Stellar Bible Adventures (bible point, bible verse, and bible story), Imagination station (crafts and science), All Star games (outdoor games and activities), Galactic snacks (food and snacks), Kid Vid Cinema (video and discussions). The children then gathered for a Cosmic Closing for a recap of the things they sang, learned, and discussed.

The kids also did a few other exciting and fun activities while at VBS. Each child was able to design and make an outer space themed t-shirt to take home. They participated in a Bible Scavenger Hunt each night, trying to be the top group to solve all the answers. They collected canned goods and had a competition of the girls versus the boys to see who could gather the most items with the donations going to the Lord's Cupboard.

The children arrived at VBS ready to play, learn and enjoy supper which was provided by different churches each evening. TUMC was responsible for supper on Thursday and served rocket fuel (grilled cheese sandwiches, veggie straws, watermelon and lemonade). TUMC helpers provided enough food for 70 people.

On the last night of VBS the parents were invited to attend a closing recap ceremony. There was a slideshow video with pictures of the children doing the activities and stations throughout the week. The parents were able to hear what the kids did and the children recited the bible verses and sang some of the songs they learned at VBS. The evening ended with a leader being pied in the face, water balloons, and a twinkie snack. The children were so excited and had a great time!

We want to take the time to say thank you to all who were involved in making VBS such a wonderful experience for the children. A special thank you to anyone from TUMC that volunteered in teaching the program and all the VBS staff. We want to thank those that prepared and helped serve supper on Thursday evening. We extend a thank you to those who made a monetary donation to the program and a big thank you to our congregation for your prayers and support.
