Administrative Council/Finance Meeting Thursday, January 19, 2023

The Trinity United Methodist Church Administrative Council meeting was held on Thursday, January 19, 2023, CMC, 5:30 p.m. Members present. Pastor Jason Christensen, Gary Linn, Cindy McNeill, Bob McNeill, Jim Wolff, Cheryl Wolff, Jane LaFollette and Lynn Larsen.

Items added to the agenda were Vacation Bible School, Winter Connection, and the 2023 Budget remediation review.

Gary Linn opened the meeting with devotion and prayer.

Jim Wolff moved/ Jane LaFollette seconded to approve the November 6, 2022 and November 21, 2022 minutes. Motion carried.

Jim Wolff, Treasurer, reviewed with the Council the Financial Reports. Jane LaFollette moved/ Cindy McNeill seconded to **approve the Treasurer's Report. Motion carried.** Sue Holloway called Pastor Jason to let him know she would be unable to attend the council meeting. Since Sue was unable to attend the meeting, it was the decision of the council not to discuss the 2023 Budget remediation review. Jim informed the council we will be converting our in-house accounting system to Tech Soup which serves nonprofit organizations. Bills and payroll will be done through this new system. Tech Soup will provide training to the office staff and committee chairs. Cindy McNeill moved/ Jane LaFollette seconded to **approve converting our in-house accounting system to Tech Soup. Motion carried.**

Bob McNeill, Trustees Chair, reported to the council the lights in the basement of the parsonage need to be replaced as the lighting in the basement is very poor. The cost to replace the lights is \$300.00. The CMC has a refrigerator that no longer works. He has received estimates up to \$2,000.00 for a new refrigerator. The sound board for our media system in the church is on its way. To get the best service from Facebook for our worship services we need to get a tablet. The cost of a tablet is \$200. Bob informed the council the cost of having snow removed in the church parking lot in December is \$2,581.00. Cheryl Wolff moved/ Jane LaFollette seconded to approve paying up to \$300.00 for the lights in the basement of the parsonage, to pay up to \$2,000.00 for the refrigerator that includes a donation of \$1,000.00, and to pay up to \$200.00 for the tablet. Motion carried.

Pastor Jason gave his report to the council that is in the church newsletter. There are four community churches, one of them being our church, that will be providing a community Vacation Bible School for our community youth this summer. He is also looking for another alternative plan in addition to VBS to keep our youth connected to our church. The youth Winter Connection will be held in Rapid City next Friday and Saturday. Three youth girls will be attending. Two adult women have volunteered to chaperone the girls but we need one more adult female to chaperone. Pastor Jason has been working on future sermon series and has completed the series through June. On the first Sunday in February he will be attending a continuing education course at Lake Poinsett.

Pastor Jason is still looking for a Chair for the Church Education committee.

Jane LaFollette, Worship Chair, reported on the Worship Committee meeting that was recently held. Discussion was held on the upcoming Lenten and Easter services. The Worship committee will be meeting quarterly.

Lynn Larsen, Member Care committee, reported Christmas cards were sent to shut-ins in December. The committee will be requesting church members to send Valentine cards to the shut-ins.

Cindy McNeill, Staff Pastor Parish chair, noted the committee will meet this coming Monday and they plan to have quarterly meetings this year.

Under New Business the council discussed considering having a new church directory. He and his staff have contacted a couple of entities who do church directories to get their prices and what they offer. One more local entity will be contacted and Pastor Jason will bring that information to the February council meeting. Pastor Jason noted there are eight high school students who will be receiving Bibles in May. Jim Wolff moved/ Cindy McNeill seconded to order Bibles to be given to the eight high school students at a cost up to \$300.00. Motion carried.

The next Administrative Council meeting will be held on Thursday, February 16, 2023, 5:30 p.m., CMC. Pastor Jason closed the meeting in prayer.

- 5. Church Building Update of Projects & Maintenance
 - a. Boiler shut off valve was repaired. Water heater needs a drain valve. Work Day project.
 - b. Bell choir shelves on hold.
- 6. CMC Building Update of Projects & Maintenance
- a. Dumpster pickup has been changed to 2 times a month. This will lower the cost of garbage pickup.
 - b. CMC was run into by a truck. Gentleman turned it into his insurance.
 - c. Power to the snowblower shed has been installed.
 - d. Floor tile in the kitchen. Suggested to remove the tile and paint the floor with epoxy.
- e. Fridge on the right is broken. Need to be replaced. Money was donated. Need a fridge with ice making capabilities. Motion was made to purchase a new fridge up to \$2000. Jim/John Approved by vote.
 - f. Small conference room, Pastor's office and hallway need louvered vents.
- 7. General
- a. Election of Trustee Officers. Motion by Jim/ Ron to retain current officers and approved by vote.. Bob McNeil President and Lee Ann Paananen Secretary
- b. Van Insurance and usage was discussed. It was decided to keep liability on it for \$486 per year Driver information needs to be updated with the insurance company.
 - c. Larry Howells son made beautiful new signs for the church rooms. They will be installed.
 - d. 5-Year Capital Plan needs to be updated
- e. CMC & Church Usage Policies: After discussion it was decided to recommend to the Admin Board to charge \$200 for weddings for church rental + \$50 clean up fee. CMC Request donations from community groups who use the CMC. Smaller groups will be asked to use the conference room instead of the large reception room. Private groups \$50 for large room and additional \$50 to use the kitchen.
- f. Snow Removal Contractors Stuen removed the snow after the big storm. Cost was \$2850.21. Thanks to our volunteers from the congregation who plow for us every time it snows.
- g. Sound Board Update: We are waiting for the soundboard to arrive from the supply company. It is anticipated to be installed around the end of January. The IPAD is old and is not working to stream church services live. There was a discussion on purchasing a new tablet. Motion was made to purchase one. Bob/Larry \$200 for new tablet and approved by vote.

Below is the "Thumbnail" version of the 2023 Budget. A detailed budget is in the Charge Conference Report. If you did not get a copy, please contact the office, 605-584-1328 to request one or they are on the table at the back of the sanctuary.

INCOME: \$119,040.00 EXPENSES: \$189,575.00 DEFICIT: \$70,535.00

Over the past 2 years, we have survived by receiving 2 grants from the Dakota Methodist Foundation because we were able to pay our apportionments and the market was good. Due to the downscale of the stock market, we will not receive a grant this year. Also, to fulfill our small fund amounts, we now need to take money from our investment accounts. Frankly, we are in a critical situation. All special projects and outreaches will need to be individually funded or taken from investment accounts. If you look at the itemized proposed budget in the Charge Conference booklet, you will see that our expenses are fixed costs. We don't have pledge cards, so our income is a guestimate and has consistently been decreasing. The Finance Committee met on January 16th and tweeked the budget again, looked at our investment accounts and brainstormed how to fundraise. We welcome your suggestions and concerns. The Ad Min meetings are open and you are welcomed to join us on the third Thursday of the month.

Adopt-A-Platoon: We are meeting at 10:30 on the first Thursday when the United Women of Faith meet. We were able to send 820 Christmas cards without having to buy 1! We hope to do the same for next Christmas. We all have unused cards that came through the mail or left over from purchases. Declutter a closet or drawer and give them to me to collect. I have already received about 150 cards from various resources. Let them collect dust at my house instead of yours. Talk to me about what to write in them and then bring them to the office. If you write a message now, that will save tons of time in October. I will be gone March 1-14, so we will need to do cards on February 23rd starting at 10:00 am.

Meals On Wheels: Our next week is Monday, February 27th through March 3rd.

Hospital Lap Robes: We meet on the second and fourth Wednesdays from 9:30 to 11:30 in the basement of Shepherd of the Hills Lutheran Church. This requires minimal skills. Talk to Sue.

Vitamins for Honduras: Many thanks to those who have donated vitamins and/or have helped work around Target's online shopping. We will have around 100 bottles of chewable kid vitamins which works out to 15,000. That equals 500 bags of 30 vitamins. That sounds like a lot but we see 2-300 kids a day in our 'clinics' and we will have 7-8 days of 'clinics'. "Send Hope's" nutritional outreach has increased from 800 kids to 2000. This is due to 2 years of Covid and multiple hurricanes washing out the limited crops that they have. Actually, I have seen few gardens but in all my travels around Puerta Lempira, I have not seen fields or crops. If you would like to help, contact Sue.

One of the United Women in Faith promotions is called The Reading Program. Every year some titles are selected in the areas of Education for Mission, Leadership Development, Nurturing for Community, Social Action, and Spiritual Growth. Titles from the last five years can be read and counted toward your goal. This is not heavy boring reading! Children's titles are included, some titles are novels, even some movies are included! Audiobooks are available. Also counting toward your goal is the Podcast "Faith Talks". I have discovered that several of the titles in the yearly selections are offered by The South Dakota Library Consortium through the free Libby App. Using the app gives us the opportunity to read without any expense of buying books. The titles I have found are: 1) "Without You There Is No Us" 2)"An Indigenous People's History of the United States" 3) "The Book of Joy" 4) "On the Come Up" 5) "I'm Still Here" 6) "Caste, The Origins of our Discontent" 7) "Three Feathers" 8) "The Four Winds" 9) "Pachinko" 10) "The Book Woman of Troublesome Creek" 11) "Eyes That Kiss in the Corners" 12) "Girl Gone Missing" 13) "The Same Sky" 14) "Hiding in the Light" 15) several other titles are to be found in our own UWF closet. Also, the Lead library staff would find titles for us too without expense.




LENTEN STUDY
