Administrative Council/Finance Meeting Thursday, June 15, 2023

The Trinity United Methodist Church Administrative Council meeting was held on Thursday, June 15, 2023, CMC, 5:30 p.m. Members present: Pastor Jason Christensen, Gary Linn, Bob McNeill, Cindy McNeill, Jim Wolff, Jane LaFollette, Sue Holloway, Cheryl Wolff, Theo Rogers and Lynn Larsen.

Gary Linn opened the meeting with devotion and prayer.

There were no changes to the agenda.

Sue Holloway moved/ Jane LaFollette seconded to **approve the April 23, 2023 minutes. Motion carried.**

Jim Wolff, Treasurer, reviewed with the Council the Financial Report. Sue Holloway moved/Jane LaFollette seconded to **approve the Financial Statements** as presented. **Motion carried.** Sue Holloway, Finance Chair, discussed the Financial Policy Manual with the admin council members.

Bob McNeill, Trustees Chair, reported to the Council they have a list of projects that will be done on the Work Days which are June 23-24.

Pastor Jason reviewed his report with the council and his report is in this newsletter.

Jane LaFollette, Worship Chair, noted they have not met recently. She is hearing many positive comments on the new addition of "Centering" at the beginning of each worship service.

Sue Holloway reported there are 27 families with 59 kids that have requested help from Clothe-A-Kid. Donations for this worthy cause are coming in. Meals on Wheels needs more couples to deliver the meals to shut-ins. Four men will be coming from Winnipeg, Canada to help with Biker Breakfast and the Canadian women will help us by giving us a head start on the Christmas cards we send out.

Cindy McNeill, Staff Pastor Parish chair, noted they will be preparing the Assessment report on the status of the church and clergy. One of the items they will be looking at this coming year will be working on outreach that will be a big opportunity for growth in our church.

Sue Holloway reported on July 6 and August 3 the Women in Faith will gather to work on the cards we send to Adopt-A-Platoon for those months. After working on the cards on August 3 the women will hold their annual picnic in the park.

Pastor Jason informed the Council he and the pastors in the Northern Hills have been in discussion on the few youth who attend youth gatherings in their church. Since these youth are isolated how can they provide programs and activities for the youth.

Jim Wolff is cleaning up the Building Use Agreement that will include the cost of the cleaning.

Pastor Jason gave an update on the Practical Church Leadership (DWU class) he will be attending in Mitchell on July 7-10, 2023.

Theo Rogers was in attendance to inform the Council she is now the Fellowship Chair and she gave a brief report. The Council thanked her for becoming the chair.

Pastor Jason and Gary Linn went to the Annual Conference and Gary reported he and Pastor Jason attended many meetings. The conference was very interesting and it gave him a good insight on the business that is done at this conference.

Trustee Meeting Minutes June 15, 2023

Pastor Jason Christensen opened the meeting with a prayer.

In attendance were Bob McNeill, Pastor Jason Christensen, Larry Howell, Jim Wolff, Wayne Holdcroft, John Hauge, Mike Darling, Ron Pray and Lee Ann Paananen.

The minutes of the April 20, 2023 meeting were reviewed and approved. Jim/Pastor Jason

Church Building Items

The ceiling in the main entry of the sanctuary was damaged from roof leak that resulted from a rock falling from the bell tower and tearing the rubber roofing. The ceiling needs to be repaired and painted. A roofer will be found to repair the roof. The stone on the bell tower needs to be caulked and sealed. It will require a lift to do it safely. Estimates will be needed for this project.

The vents in the sanctuary need to be cleaned. This will be a workday project.

Fans were discussed - no action needed.

Chain link fence, basketball hoop and other garbage have accumulated by the shed and need to be cleaned out. Ron will clean it out and take it to the dump.

Johnson Room - Florescent lights out. Ballast needs to be repaired. John suggested LED conversion. The small closet door in the loft needs to be shaved, as the door sticks and the slider doors need to be lubricated. This will be a workday project.

The pews need to be cleaned and polished. Lee will do pews and windows on workdays.

There are lights out above the trim in the sanctuary that need to be replaced.

CMC

The flooring in the CMC kitchen, hallways and bathrooms is loose and coming up in many places. Options discussed were to get a third-party moisture test to ascertain the cause of the problem and John will talk to the company who does epoxy flooring for an estimate.

Projects for Workday include fixing the holes in the concrete on the outside of the building, cleaning the vents, cleaning up the parking lot by sweeping and power washing it. The parking lot strips will be repainted when it is clean. HVAC company needs to be scheduled on an annual basis to check the filters and replace them. Teah and Theo will be in charge of the kitchen cleanup.

The outside rug in the entry to the CMC needs to be replaced.

The retaining wall on the Fuller side of the parking lot has been cleaned up and looks very nice. There was discussion about a memorial garden. No decision was made until further review and discussion.

Parsonage

Workday projects for the parsonage include pulling and killing the weeds around the air conditioner, sealing the bricks on the siding, touch up paint on the siding and around the windows and the basement lights that need to be replaced.

Workdays are June 23 and 24 starting at 9:00 am.

Bob closed the meeting.
