Administrative Council/Finance Meeting Thursday, February 16, 2023

The Trinity United Methodist Church Administrative Council meeting was held on Thursday, February 16, 2023, CMC, 5:30 p.m. Members present: Pastor Jason Christensen, Gary Linn, Bob McNeill, Jim Wolff, Cheryl Wolff, Sue Holloway and Lynn Larsen.

Gary Linn opened the meeting with devotion and prayer.

There were no changes to the agenda.

Cheryl Wolff moved/ Bob McNeill seconded to approve the January 19, 2023 minutes. Motion carried.

Jim Wolff, Treasurer, reviewed with the Council the Financial Report. He informed the council all the data has been entered into Quickbooks which is now being used to pay the bills. Payroll is about 75% ready to go through Tech Soup for employee salary compensation. Jim also presented to the council the forms and information on the Profit and Loss and Balance Sheet. Sue Holloway moved/Bob McNeill seconded to **approve the Financial Statements** as presented. **Motion carried.** Sue noted there is no print off on the investments.

Bob McNeill, Trustees Chair, reported to the council the bathtub at the parsonage had some cracks and those have been fixed. He also noted Sanford Lab needs to find two buildings in Lead for emergency lab situations that may arise with the lab. The consensus of the council is Sanford Lab can use the CMC facility for emergency uses.

Pastor Jason gave his report to the council that is included in this church newsletter. A Lenten study, "People of Passion" will be offered starting on February 28. The Ash Wednesday service will be held on February 22 at 7 p.m. Holy week services include a Maundy Thursday and Good Friday service. Upcoming events are a meeting on February 28 to start making plans for the community Vacation Bible School this summer and a community wide service to be held July 2 at the high school with a potluck to follow. He is still looking for a Chair for the Church Education committee.

Lynn Larsen, Member Care committee, reported Valentine cards were sent out to church members who are in assisted living, nursing homes and for the shut-ins.

Sue Holloway noted Meals on Wheels will be the week of March 27. Five hundred Adopt-A-Platoon cards have been sent and another five hundred cards will be put together on February 23 to send out to our troops. She has volunteered to chair Biker Breakfast again this year. There will be a few people staying at her home during Biker Week and they have volunteered to help with Biker Breakfast. The quilting group is working hard to make quilts. Many of them are used for the swing beds at the Deadwood hospital.

The sound system in the church is being updated and is improving. Purchasing a new I-Pad has certainly helped the sound system work much better.

Cynthia McNeill is in the process of signing up church members to have their picture taken for the new Church Directory.

A discussion was held on the rental Usage Agreement fees. If the church is rented, the cost is \$200 + \$50 for custodial care. The use of the CMC is \$150 and if the kitchen is used for preparation of food for the event an extra \$50 will be charged. Sue Holloway moved/Bob McNeill seconded to **approve increasing the costs as presented. Motion carried.**

The Bibles to be given to seniors in May have arrived. Places will be determined where church members will be able to sign the Bibles.

An Inclement Weather Policy is being put into place so the church members have information to know when the church services or other happenings held during the week will be cancelled. For the weeks of Monday through Friday, we will follow what the school is doing. No school, no church activities; late start or early out we do the same. For Saturday and Sunday we will contact the church members through a telephone tree. Church members will receive telephone calls at 5 p.m. on Saturday afternoon to let church members know the church services have been cancelled for Sunday. Please refer to the weather policy in this newsletter.

Monument is offering a Suicide Prevention Training for Faith Leaders. The rate of suicides, most of whom are young girls, in our area is increasing. This has definitely become a big problem and training is much needed for faith leaders in our communities. Cheryl Wolff moved/ Sue Holloway seconded to approve church leaders and members who want to take this training. Motion carried.

My original contact has returned home and I will be establishing a relationship with his replacements. We will continue to impact 500 service people a month through our cards and letters. God will touch the hearts of those that need us and personal contacts will be kindled. Please continue to stay in contact with Jeremiah.

Meals On Wheels: Our next week is Monday, February 27th through March 3rd and is being done as you read this newsletter. Because we are on a 5 week schedule, our next delivery dates are April 3rd through the 7th.




