From Pastor Jason's Desk

Greeting friends, have you ever thought about what this season of lent really means? Here are some thoughts I have on lent.

Lent, the period of forty days before Easter, is a time of reflection and preparation for Christians around the world. This solemn season holds deep significance, rooted in both history and faith. Its observance varies among Christian denominations, but the core themes remain consistent: repentance, fasting, and spiritual growth.

The word "Lent" itself comes from the Old English word "lencten," meaning springtime, highlighting the season's connection to renewal and rebirth. This period begins on Ash Wednesday, when many Christians receive ashes on their foreheads as a symbol of penitence and mortality. It concludes with Easter Sunday, the celebration of Jesus Christ's resurrection.

Lent mirrors the forty days Jesus spent fasting in the wilderness, enduring temptation and preparing for his ministry. Likewise, believers use this time for introspection, prayer, and self-denial. Fasting, a common practice during Lent, serves as a reminder of dependence on God and a way to focus more fully on spiritual matters.

Another key aspect of Lent is almsgiving, or charitable giving. This practice emphasizes compassion and solidarity with those in need, following the example of Jesus's ministry to the poor and marginalized. Through acts of service and generosity, believers seek to embody Christ's love and bring hope to others.

Lent is also a time of intensified prayer. Many Christians use this season to deepen their relationship with God through daily prayer, meditation, and scripture reading. This intentional focus on spiritual disciplines can lead to a renewed sense of purpose and direction in life.

While Lent is a time of solemnity, it is also a journey toward joy. The season culminates in Holy Week, the final week of Lent, which includes Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday. These days commemorate Jesus's Last Supper with his disciples, his crucifixion, and his time in the tomb, respectively. The darkness of these events gives way to the light of Easter Sunday, the celebration of Christ's victory over sin and death.

In conclusion, Lent is a season of preparation, transformation, and renewal. It invites believers to deepen their faith, grow in virtue, and draw closer to God. Through fasting, prayer, and almsgiving, Christians seek to emulate Christ's sacrifice and love, ultimately leading to the joyous celebration of Easter.

#### <u>Trinity United Methodist</u> <u>Church Library Notes</u>



CS Lewis is one of the most popular Christian writers if not THE most popular, (besides God).

"CS Lewis is the ideal persuader for the half convinced, for the good man who would like to be a Christian, but finds his intellect getting in the way." -Anthony Burgess

We now have the essential writings of CS Lewis in our library and I encourage you to pick out one or two and read them. They are short books-they may take 3 1/2 to 4 hours to read.

**Mere Christianity** Mr. Lewis was asked by the BBC to give lectures to the British people over the radio during World War 2. This is a collection of those lectures. He discusses theology in a convincing, witty manner. His teaching reaches the doubting believer who finds that he or she can have a relationship with Christ without losing their intellect. His talks gave Brits encouragement during their most desperate times. This is a must-read for the believer and skeptics alike.

**Surprised by Joy** is CS Lewis' autobiographical story of his early life and how he eventually came to put his faith in Jesus Christ.

**The Screwtape Letters** is a witty, ironic portrayal of human life from the viewpoint of the demon Screwtape. It depicts the correspondence between the wise-old Screwtape and his nephew demon Wormwood. This book is fun, yet sobering!

**Miracles** Do miracles really happen? In this book, CS Lewis points out that miracles are happening all around us, everyday.

**The Problem of Pain** If there is a God, why do people or animals have to suffer pain? Many people find they cannot put their faith in a God who allows us to go through suffering and pain. Mr. Lewis attempts to answer this question with compassion, offering hope to those who suffer.

**The Four Loves** Mr. Lewis divides love into four categories: Affection, Friendship, Eros and Charity. The first three come naturally, but without Charity, things tend to fall apart.

We also have the complete set of The Chronicles of Narnia by CS Lewis.
