On Thursday, April 22, the administrative council voted to remove all Covid-19 restrictions beginning May 1.

- Fellowship following worship in the Christian Ministry Center (CMC) will resume on May 2
- For communion we will still be using the pre-packaged communion cups, but will be inviting people forward to receive them. (We’re using the pre-packaged until we run out—we don’t want them to go to waste)
- The cry room and busy bags will be available, and the nursery will be open as soon as it is completed

TUMC ADMINISTRATIVE COUNCIL/FINANCE MEETING

The Trinity United Methodist Church Administrative Council/Finance meeting was held on Thursday, April 22, 2021, 6:30 p.m., via ZOOM. Members present: Pastor Peggy Hanson, Gary Linn, Sue Holloway, Syd DeVries, Shelli DeVries, Cindy McNeill, Bob McNeill, Jane LaFollette, Brian Hanson, Correen Dammen, and Lynn Larsen.

Gary Linn called the meeting to order and opened the meeting with a devotion and prayer.

When Sue Holloway gets to the meeting at a later time, the Financial Report will be reviewed. Syd DeVries moved/ Bob McNeill seconded to **approve the March 18, 2021 minutes** as printed. **Motion carried.**

Bob McNeill, Trustees Chair, reported the committee met for a short meeting to review the Wesley Room project. Discussion was held on the easement of the sale of the two properties next to the church. The Council reviewed the new easement document that was changed to be a more precise document on the property. Bob McNeill moved/ Correen Dammen seconded to **approve the Easement Document signed by Susan Holloway, Robert McNeill and John Hauge on March 30, 2021. Motion carried.** Bob also discussed with the Council the new security system that is going to be implemented in the church and the CMC. He informed the members there is enough money in the budget to start putting in the wiring. By doing this we will be ready to go when we receive the rest of the money to put in the cameras. Syd DeVries moved/Jane LaFollette seconded to **allocate the remaining funds from the Builders Project Fund to start putting in the wiring for the security system. Motion carried.**

Pastor Peggy informed the Admin Council Terri Keene has resigned as the Lay Leader and Finance Treasurer. Pastor Peggy will begin the search for a lay leader. She reported she and Becky Kosters will be taking a 13 week course on grief counseling. They are hoping to start group grief counseling gatherings around May 18th. Upcoming funerals and memorials will be held for June Iverson and Bob Harvey in June. Annual Conference this June will be Hybrid. She will be going to Sioux Falls with CCYM and Dakota Strategy team for a pre-conference meeting. The clergy session will be held virtually. Our church is in need of a lay delegate to the conference. The last day for early bird camp registrations is April 30. Brittane Mattson and she will be attending Youth Worker Academy training at Storm Mountain April 23-25. During the summer TUMC will be connecting with other churches in the Northern Hills to do weekly missional experiences. She will be taking a couple of vacation days in May.

There were no reports from the Worship Committee, Memorials and Trinity United Methodist Women.

Shelli DeVries, Christian Ed Chair, reported Vacation Bible School will be held from July 11-15, 2021. So far eight people have volunteered to help but Shelli said she could use a couple more volunteers. The Bible study she is leading on Thursdays is going well. The group is studying the book of Philippians. The Sunday School committee is looking for a curriculum. Sunday School will start the first Sunday after Labor Day.

Lynn Larsen, Member Care, reported church members sent Easter cards to members who are shut-in or in a nursing home/assisted living. She noted that a few of those who are receiving cards have sent a "thank you" to the church for the cards they are getting from church members.

Cindy McNeill, Staff Pastor Parish Chair, updated the Council on the meeting they recently had. They did a quarterly review of Pastor Peggy's salary. Due to the fact that the current church's financial situation is not strong enough to increase her salary, SPPRC committee at this meeting made a motion and approved to make no salary adjustment at this time. They will review again the pastor's salary in late June or early July. Discussion was held on office staff accrual of vacation time. Also at this meeting SPPRC made a motion and approved to limit accrual of vacation time to 40 hours maximum. Cindy informed the Council the need of having nursery care providers at the Wesley Room during worship services. It was decided to table this discussion until the May council meeting. The Staff Pastor Parish committee is currently working on the 2021 Clergy/Church Annual Assessment that is due to the Dakotas Conference by mid-June.

Sue Holloway, Missions Committee, noted more volunteers are needed to do Meals on Wheels. May 16-22, 2021 is the next week our church will be delivering meals to shut-ins. Adopt-a-Platoon card distributions to military personnel is coming up again with volunteers signing the cards that will be sent out to the troops.

Sue Holloway reviewed with the Board the Financial Statements. Syd DeVries moved/Correen Dammen seconded to **approve the Financial Reports** as presented. **Motion carried.** Sue is recommending the church apportionments stay at our 10% apportionment giving.

Pastor Peggy opened up the discussion on what we do in the church and CMC if we lift Covid restrictions. If we would decide to remove all restrictions we are currently doing, we would pull the tape from the pews and cushions will go back on the pews along with the hymnals and Bibles. Church members will be able to go to the front of the church to receive communion. The church bulletins and passing the offering plates will start. Children will be able to come forward for the Children's Sermon. Fellowship after church will start again. Community organizations who use the CMC for their meetings will also be able to use the CMC without restrictions. Masks will be optional. Syd DeVries moved/Correen Dammen seconded to **remove the COVID restrictions in the sanctuary and CMC effective May 2, 2021. Motion carried.**

Sue Holloway reported she has started doing the paperwork for Biker Breakfast. There will be sign up sheets at the CMC for those who will volunteer to help with Biker Breakfast. By doing this we will have an idea how many will be helping. Sue said a decision to have or not have Biker Breakfast this summer will have to be made at the June council meeting.

The next Finance/ Administrative Council meeting will be held on Thursday, May 20, 2021, 6:30 p.m. CMC, in-house.

Pastor Peggy closed the meeting with prayer.

Miracle Offering

Each year at Annual Conference – a Miracle offering is taken as part of worship. This offering is designated to a specific cause. In the past it's gone to support developing ministries in the Bakken oil field, church starts, flood relief and more. This year, Bishop Laurie Haller invites us to participate in yet another miraculous expression of God's love in action through the miracle offering of Feeding the Dakotas.

We know that it has been a challenging year. The COVID-19 pandemic has created an economic recession, ending years of declining food insecurity rates – the lack of access to sufficient food because of the limited financial resources. Feeding America estimates that 45 million people (1 in 7), including 15 million children (1 in 5), may have experienced food insecurity in 2020. In South Dakota, 1 in 9 persons and 1 in 6 children face hunger daily. In North Dakota 1 in 15 persons and 1 in 10 children are struggling with hunger daily.

The goal for 2021 Miracle offering: Feeding the Dakotas is \$75,000 to be shared with the Great Plains Food Bank in North Dakota, Feeding South Dakota, and grants to local hunger ministries. Minutes from the last meeting were reviewed and approved.

Update on the van—all additional items that were needed for the van were purchased and just need to be placed in the van. We have received the insurance cards and policy information.

Wesley Room Update—work is going along well. More paint needed to be purchased. Furniture has arrived and is in the CMC front room, the wall divider was ordered and is in route. Pastor Peggy is getting an additional technology quote from Audio Visual Solutions. The next step will be to shampoo/clean the carpets and furniture. They will also shampoo the pew cushions while they are doing this. The final step will be relocating the memorial plaques into the Wesley Room, and the drawings of the churches that were in the hallway are being reframed.

Update on Projects:

The trustees have been hard at work and we'd like to share with you an update on our ongoing projects.

Hospitality Project:

The Wesley Room and hallway renovation is almost complete! A special thanks to the hard work, dedication, and expertise to the Trustees team. When all the work is complete, we will invite folks following worship to see the updated spaces, including the youth rooms upstairs where the church offices used to be. All that is left on this project is the technology portion.

Stewardship Project:

- Increasing security for the CMC and Church – Total Cost: \$3400 (Have **\$600** to begin the project)
- Project includes: Making our internet more secure (it has been breached), installing cameras in both the CMC and the church, DVR to record and store videos
- Labor will be completed by a skilled volunteer**
- Purpose: To be good stewards of our buildings. To protect our spaces and all those who utilize our buildings

Futurist Connection Project:

- Updating sound, acoustics, and video in the sanctuary – Have received **\$200** for this project
- Project includes: Installing acoustic paneling, updating our sound board, purchasing and installing cameras, purchasing a new computer and software, and updating media space
- Purpose: To help connect people through worship, both on-site and those who connect with us digitally and through the radio, by enhancing the quality of sound and video.
- This project is something we are working on and working towards to continue to connect to our community and beyond.

These projects are breathing life into our church and are in need of nurturing and support by you, our congregation. 


