(1 Thessalonians 1:2-3) I give thanks for each of you and your faithful service and support in this year. Together we are steadfast in our hope in Jesus and WE WILL get through this challenging time together.

(For those who attempted to listen to the radio on October 25, KDSJ was having technical difficulties and was not able to stream the service. They did apologize).

Trinity United Methodist Church Admin/Finance and Charge Conference Meeting Minutes

The Trinity United Methodist Church Charge Conference and Administrative Council/Finance meetings were held on Thursday, October 22, 2020, 6:30 p.m., via ZOOM. Members present: Pastor Peggy Hanson, Gary Linn, Sue Holloway, Tammy Gilbery, Becky Kosters, Joyce Darling, Syd DeVries, Jane LaFollette, Terri Keene, Jacque Fuller, Brian Hanson, Cindy McNeill, Bob McNeill, LeeAnn Paananen and Lynn Larsen.

District Superintendent, Rev. Rob Ruebusch, conducted the Charge Conference meeting. He opened the meeting with scripture and prayer. Rev. Ruebusch asked the members to tell him what were some of the positive happenings and challenges in this church this past year especially in the light of the COVID-19 virus. Members mentioned the positive happenings were weekly mailings of sermons, easy access to radio, Facebook and website for Sunday services, congregational care to keep members informed on events in the church, and card greetings that were sent to Adopt-A-Platoon. Challenges included connecting with young families, working on plans to reopen the church after it had been closed and pulling together to reopen the church in a safe way for everyone.

It was noted our church has no candidates for ministry and also no Lay Servant Ministers or Certified Lay Ministers. The Lay Leadership Nominations were reviewed by the members. **All voted aye for the Leadership Nominations for 2021.**

The members reviewed the Membership Report. **All voted aye to affirm the Membership Report.**

Cynthia McNeill reviewed with the members the Clergy Compensation worksheet. **All voted aye to affirm the 2021 Clergy Compensation for Pastor Peggy Hanson.**

Other reports in the Charge Conference booklet include the Pastor's Report, Facilities Report, and Trustees Report. Rev. Ruebusch closed the meeting thanking the members for attending the Charge Conference meeting.

The Administrative/Finance meeting began at 7:00 p.m. Cathy Collins joined the meeting with the same members in attendance who attended the Charge Conference meeting.

Sue Holloway moved/Terri Keene seconded to **approve the September 24, 2020 minutes. Motion carried.** Pastor Peggy reported Sue Holloway is the new Finance Chair. The Financial Reports were reviewed. Sue Holloway moved/Tammy Gilbery seconded to **approve the Financial Reports** as presented. **Motion carried.** Discussion was held whether to keep paying 8% on apportionments or 16% on apportionments. Brian Hanson moved/ Sue Holloway seconded to **stick to 8% for apportionments and to review this item in three months. Motion carried.**

Terri Keene, Finance Treasurer, reported the \$10,000.00 CD at Wells Fargo is coming due and she has checked on interest rates at the local banks. Syd DeVries moved/Tammy Gilbery seconded to **move the \$10,000.00 investment from Wells Fargo Bank to the First National Bank with a .25% interest rate beginning November 2, 2020. Motion carried.**

Bob McNeill, Trustees Chair, stated there was no meeting this month, the asphalt repair is on hold and the snow shovel schedule has been put together.

Pastor Peggy Hanson told the members she and Terri Keene attended the Annual Conference online on October 10th. She will continue sending out worship kits. With the Advent season coming up soon, she wants to discuss with the Council the Christmas Eve service. She stated because of COVID-19 we need to be realistic on our limitations of keeping the service safe but still meaningful. The number of people we can have in our sanctuary at this time is 50. Pastor Peggy asked members for suggestions for having the Christmas Eve service. A couple of suggested ideas were having the service in the high school auditorium or at the Opera House. Her suggestion is to have a live Nativity Scene outside of the CMC. To celebrate Christmas, cars will drive through our parking lot. The consensus of the members is for Pastor Peggy to explore this idea and to bring back a plan in November.

Tammy Gilbery, Worship, is thinking of having a third grade Christmas pageant that will be recorded for members to watch on Facebook and the website.

Lynn Larsen, Member Care, reported they will be asking members to send cards to those in assisted living, nursing homes and shut-ins for Thanksgiving and Christmas. List of those members to send cards to will be in the November and December newsletters.

Sue Holloway, Missions, noted there are changes this year to the Shoe Box Christmas gifts. Plastic shoe boxes will be used instead of cardboard shoe boxes. Students from the Middle School and High School Honor Societies will be signing Thanksgiving and Christmas cards for military men and women through the Adopt-A-Platoon project. On behalf of United Methodist Women, Sue said there have been no meetings due to COVID-19 and does not know if they will have the annual Christmas gathering between UMW and the Presbyterian women.

Discussion on gathering in the sanctuary for worship service was held. With the numbers of the virus going up in the county and state do we continue to still offer having church services in the sanctuary or do we go back to worshipping at home through KDSJ, Facebook and the website? Syd DeVries moved/Sue Holloway seconded to **suspend worship services effective immediately until such time the pandemic is under control. Motion carried.**

The next Administrative Council meeting will be held Thursday, November 19, 2020, 6:30 p.m. via ZOOM. Pastor Peggy closed the meeting with prayer.





I must admit to feeling quite uninspired recently, chalking it up to summer's passing, Covid-19 fatigue (not that I've had it, but efforts to avoid it), and being unable to associate with those who make life lighter and brighter.

However, for this report I have gone to resources I know I can trust and will be agreeable to my sharing information, namely www.unitedmethodistwomen.org and YouTube for various videos of interest to us as United Methodist Women. From the article Why United Methodist Women Engage in Social Action: For more than 150 years Methodist women organized for mission have worked in the name of Jesus to take positions on social justice issues and change legislation, systems, structures and practices considered unjust and oppressive. These bold foremothers advocated to end lynching, improve women's health, raise women's status in society, organize for fair wages and benefits for workers and families and adopt the Charter for Racial Justice.

Today, we continue to build on this foundation as we work to end maternal mortality, attain a living wage for all, interrupt the school-to-prison pipeline and ensure energy that is just for all. As United Methodist Women of the 21st century, we are called to be bold in our witness, working to dismantle systems of oppression and build, together, a better world.

From another article What Can We Do About COVID-19: Wash your hands! Stay home! But that's not all. The pandemic has made visible the fractures in our society, where the most marginal communities are already being hard hit. Among them Native American tribes, Asian Americans facing racist vitriol, low wage workers facing layoffs, women facing domestic violence while in quarantine, incarcerated people, poor people, those without shelter, immigrant workers, farm workers, children without internet access, those with chronic illnesses, and many more.

United Methodist Women urges members to advocate for federal relief and stimulus packages that put people and the earth first and build for permanent solutions to economic inequality, structural racism, gender inequality and climate injustices.

This message was received through the Trinity UMC Facebook page. Your cards, written notes, and prayers are making an impact.

Hello, My name is SPC Kevin Larson. I am an active duty Army soldier deployed to the Middle East. I received a care package today from "Adopt a Platoon" and received this wonderful card and letter from Sue and the Ladies of Trinity United Methodist Church in Lead, SD. I want to start off by offering my sincerest gratitude for the heart warming letter and card! I haven't received much mail since being deployed, so this was a humble surprise! I made it back to my barracks room this evening at hit my knees in prayer with tears in my eyes. I thought to myself, who else would have made this particular letter come to me versus the another one of the thousands of soldiers serving abroad? The only answer to this fate, is Jesus! You may think, well why is it such a surprise? I'll tell you why. I, too, am a Black Hills of South Dakota resident born and raised. I am from Custer, SD. My mother still lives there, and my grandmother in Hot Springs. So, I knew from the moment that when I seen this letter was from "home", that it was delivered not just by the USPS, but by the mighty hands of our God. Thank you all for making this soldiers day. I have been missing my wife and son, but receiving this letter from "home" reminded me that God is in control and will always surprise us when we least expect it. And to this I will cite 2 Corinthians 4:15 "All this is for your benefit, so that the grace that is reaching more and more people may cause thanksgiving to overflow to the glory of God."
