Hello friends, November is upon us. We, as a church, are in the process of preparing for the Advent season, while it may seem still a little too soon. Here are my thoughts as we prepare to give thanks for the things and the people in our lives.

In our world and in our society today we often think of being thankful for the things that we have in our lives, you know that stuff that we have accumulated over the years. What I find myself thinking about today is that all of our stuff could be gone in a minute then what? How can you and I change our hearts and our minds and show Christian love, grace, and kindness to all? What can you do today and in the weeks ahead to embrace these people?

I will be reflecting on the people in my life and thanking God for each and everyone of them. To say thanks for the differences in options, the different ideals, and standards that we all live by. What we must remember is that we as Christians are constantly being watched by our culture and our society to see if we as Christians can be thankful for all of the people in our lives. Can we as Christians be thankful for the tough times and the challenges we face in our daily lives?

Before more time passes, I want to say this I am thankful for all of you and for the influence you have in my life. I am thankful for the difference in opinions, the difference in how we see things and how we live our lives. I see these differences as a chance for me to grow as a person to be the Christians that God has called me to be. Can and will you join me in this challenge?

Administrative Council/Finance Meeting Thursday, September 28, 2023

The Trinity United Methodist Church Administrative Council meeting was held on Thursday, September 28, 2023, CMC, 5:30 p.m. Members present: Pastor Jason Christensen, Gary Linn, Sue Holloway, Bob McNeill, Cindy McNeill, Jim Wolff, and Lynn Larsen.

Gary Linn called the meeting to order and opened with devotion and prayer.

Sue Holloway moved/Cindy McNeill seconded to **approve the August 31, 2023 minutes** with one change that the September council meeting will be on September 28, 2023 and not September 21, 2023. **Motion carried.**

There were no changes to the agenda.

Jim Wolff reviewed the Financial Report with the Council. Sue Holloway moved/ Cindy McNeill seconded to **approve the Financial Report** as presented. **Motion carried.** Jim said our finances came through the summer in good shape and our church investments have picked up. Discussion was held on the final version of the Building Usage Agreement. Sue Holloway moved/ Cindy McNeill seconded to **approve the Building Usage Agreement. Motion carried.** Work on the 2024 Church Budget will begin on October 11, 2023.

Bob McNeill, Trustees Chair, reported to the Council the lines in the CMC parking lot have been painted.

Pastor Jason reviewed his monthly report with the council. Two women have approached him about using the CMC for a women's exercise walk workout. He also noted these women would like to replace the current large banner in the CMC with something more eye pleasing and décor appropriate. There will be a community Thanksgiving service on November 22. The Blue Christmas service will be held on December 21 in our church.

Lynn Larsen, Member Care Chair, reported they will be asking church members to send Halloween cards to our shut-ins and those who are in assisted living and nursing homes.

Sue Holloway gave many reports on the activities she leads. Meals on Wheels delivery is October 30-November 3. This will be a busy week for a church family so she will need more help to deliver meals.

We are moving forward towards sending out Christmas cards to our military troops but we still need more Christmas cards to meet our goal of sending 1000 cards. Wonderful women have been taking bundles of Christmas cards to work on.

The total income from Biker Breakfast brought in \$8,036.00, expenses were \$3,070.45, with a net income of \$2,934.55.

The Halloweenie event will be held on October 31 from 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. Church members will be asked for donations of candy and small gifts for this event.

The South Dakota Largest Home Party is November 4 at the CMC. The actual income for "Send Hope" comes from the table fees and bake sale but we also want our vendors to come back so we need to support them. The donations from the soup luncheon will benefit the mission of the United Women in Faith. Shopping hours are from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. and the luncheon will be served from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m.

The Church Youth Community (CYC) has been developed to make TUMC more visible and involved with the community. There is a need to provide projects for our students to perform that will fulfill their required hours of service. On November 11, Veteran's Day, the service project will be between 3 p.m. to 5 p.m. where students will help with the Christmas cards we are sending to the military men and women. A community free dinner will be served between 5 p.m. to 6 p.m. The dinner will begin with the American Legion with their Honor Guard presentation of the flags. Later, our bell choir will play patriotic music asking those attending to sing along. At the end of the event the Legion will end the event with a presentation on the meaning of each fold of the flag during the Retiring of the Colors.

Cindy McNeill, Staff Pastor Parish Committee Chair, informed the Council they will be meeting with the staff and Pastor Jason in order to estimate a salary compensation for 2024 as they prepare the 2024 church budget.

Sue Holloway gave a report on Women in Faith. Their next meeting will be held on Thursday, October 5. A thank offering will be held at the meeting. Prior to the meeting women will work on Thanksgiving cards that go to Adopt-A-Platoon. A light lunch will be prepared for the women who work on the cards prior to the WIF meeting.

Discussion was held on the donations that have been made to AED funding in our church. Pastor Jason visited with Janet Lanphear, Memorial Committee Chair, about giving money to AED from the memorial funds. The Memorial Committee moved/ Sue Holloway seconded to **give up to \$1,000.00 from the Church Memorial Funds to the AED Funds. Motion carried.**

Pastor Jason informed the council he is close to completing the first part on the classes he is taking. He gave an overview to the Council on his next step which will be classes on Financial Resource Development.

The next Administrative Council meeting will be held on Thursday, October 19, 2023, 5:30 p.m., CMC.

Gary Linn called the meeting to order and opened with devotion and prayer.

Cindy McNeill requested adding under Old Business discussion on the Church Directory. Jim Wolff moved/Sue Holloway seconded to **approve the agenda with the addition to discuss the Church Directory. Motion carried.**

Cheryl Wolff moved/Sue Holloway seconded to **approve the September 28, 2023 minutes as presented. Motion carried.**

Jim Wolff reviewed the Financial Report with the Council. Sue Holloway moved/ Cindy McNeill seconded to **approve the Financial Report** as presented. **Motion carried.** Jim requested transferring \$10,000.00 from our investments into cash. Jim Wolff moved/Sue Holloway seconded to **transfer \$10,000.00 from the church investments into cash. Motion carried.** The council reviewed the proposed 2024 Church Budget. Sue Holloway moved/Cindy McNeill seconded to **accept the proposed 2024 Church Budget with the minor changes that were made. Motion carried.**

Bob McNeill, Trustees Chair, reported to the Council the trustees are going building by building doing maintenance projects that need to be done.

Pastor Jason reviewed his monthly report with the council. He informed them Charge Conference will be held on Sunday, November 12, after church. He is working with the Homestake Opera House for the Live Dramatization of the Last Supper. This production will be offered to the community sometime during Holy Week 2024.

Sue Holloway, Missions Chair, updated the council on upcoming events. Halloweenie will be held on Halloween at the CMC. Teah Pray and Theo Rogers will be in charge of this event and will be providing Walking Tacos for the youngsters. The South Dakota's home show has been cancelled due to only 7 vendors selling their wares. The Community Christmas dinner was cancelled as she was unable to get the help she needs to put this on. Meals on Wheels is the week of October 29.

Cindy McNeill, Staff Pastor/Parish Chair, reported they have completed the necessary report that needs to be done on the church staff. The committee has agreed on the salary for the staff and Pastor Jason.

Sue Holloway noted United Women in Faith will have a Christmas party in December with the Presbyterian women.

CYC (Church, Youth and Community committee) is working on having a community event in February.

Cindy McNeill who was in charge of the church directory reported a total number of 79 pictures were taken. We are purchasing an additional 67 directories for the pews, for those who supplied pictures and for the office staff. The final draft for the directory has been approved and we should be getting the directories in late November.

Pastor Jason gave a Dakota Wesleyan update on branding our churches due to the separation of the Methodist churches. We don't know yet how this will affect Trinity United Methodist Church in branding our church such as the flame and cross.

The next Administrative Council meeting will be held on Thursday, November 16, 2023, 5:30 p.m., CMC. There will be no December meeting due to the Blue Christmas service being held at our church on the same evening. The AED's are here!!

Thanks to the generosity of both individuals and groups, Trinity now has two AED's (Automated External Defibrillators). One is in the CMC next to the coat rack and the other will be in the rear of the sanctuary. We purchased these through the Avera Hospital.

The beauty of an AED is that it saves lives and can be used without training. Just open the case up and there is a female voice who will take you through the steps. We ask, however, that you not open the wall cabinet or case unless there is a true emergency so as not to damage the equipment.

Becoming familiar with the AED prior to using it for an emergency is helpful. The Lead Deadwood Monument Hospital EMT's will be providing education on how to use the AED and perform CPR, and will be offering optional certification through the American Heart Association. Certification costs 20 dollars. We don't know the date yet, as it is dependent upon many people's schedule. There will be a sign-up sheet in the CMC for the class. Include your phone and email so that we can contact you when we get a firm date. All are welcome, even if you don't want to get certified.

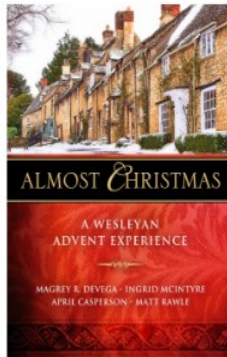
Bible Study

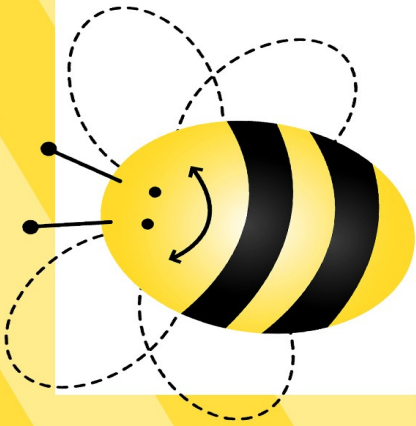
Live Nativity

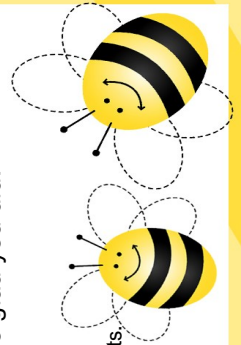
We welcome anyone in the Lead-Deadwood community who would like to walk indoors or participate in some low impact exercise videos.
