From Pastor Jason's desk

Late summer, the kids are back in school and the college kids have left for their fall classes. I love fall and the crisp feel of the air. I am looking forward to the fall colors and the changing of the seasons.

With fall comes memories of being on the ranch and the cutting of hay and the harvest from the spring planting. You and I as Christians, in our world today, are called to be planting good seeds for the kingdom of God so that those seeds can grow and mature into the people and the disciples that God has called each of us to be. One of the most difficult things, I think, for us as Christians is that we are not always there for the harvest, we are often called just to prepare the ground or clear the stumps and the fruits of our labors are often seen by someone other than us.

Where are you and I planting seeds in our daily lives, are we sowing seeds in ground that can produce a good crop and later a bountiful harvest? Or are we sowing seeds on bad ground or on rocks where the winds can carry them away and not produce the harvest for God we are called to produce.

Jesus told this parable in Matthew chapter thirteen verses three through nine.

Then he told them many things in parables, saying: "A farmer went out to sow his seed. As he was scattering the seed, some fell along the path, and the birds came and ate it up. Some fell on rocky places, where it did not have much soil. It sprang up quickly because the soil was shallow. But when the sun came up, the plants were scorched, and they withered because they had no roots. Other seed fell among thorns, which grew up and choked the plants. Still other seeds fell on good soil, where it produced a crop—a hundred, sixty or thirty times what was sown. Whoever has ears, let them hear."

As your pastor, I hope and pray all of us has an opportunity to plant good seeds for the kingdom of God so that lives may be transformed. This will not just happen; you and I have to make a conscious effort to ensure that we are planting good seeds and those seeds are planted in good fertile soil. I believe, that to be the Christians Jesus expects us to be, we must be actively seeking opportunities to plant the seeds of the kingdom and make sure we are doing all we can to help those that do not know Jesus.

You have heard me say this before, at some point in time you and I have to face Jesus and he is going to ask what we have done to plant seeds for His kingdom to make a difference here on this earth. I want all of us to be able to say I planted seeds for your kingdom and I did all I could to prepare the ground for a harvest that is worthy of bearing you name. We have a crop to plant, one that we may or may not get to harvest, our children and grandchildren will be the harvesters we owe it to them to sow good seeds in fertile ground. Our loved ones are important to us. Isn't their salvation worth a little hard work now?

Lets go out and plant some seeds for Jesus. Pastor Jason

BIKER BREAKFAST: The Biker Breakfast was successful as an outreach to our returning friends and new friends. This is the new purpose of the event. With decreasing numbers of bikers overall, we had decreased numbers that ate with us. Another contributing factor is the glut of vacation rentals being used rather than hotel/motel rooms. We did serve 618 meals not counting all the workers. We had 24 that participated in the free/1/2 price meals and 5 free meals for our first responders. Tips for the Lord's Cupboard equaled \$931 and donations amounted to 1,100. Gross income from the meals equaled 5,532. Lynn's bill has not been received so we don't know the gross amount. We did spend +300 for coffee and a small bill for the 250 "credit card" used for the decreased meals.

AED FUNDING

Hello all. Let's face it, we are all getting older! As a result, we are more prone to developing severe heart health issues such as heart attack, heart rhythm problems, and heart stoppage.

Our church sanctuary and the Christian Ministry Center desperately need AED's (Automatic External Defibrillators). If someone's heart stops, or goes into an abnormal rhythm, AED's can not only shock someone's heart back into a normal rhythm but also give spoken instructions and monitor how effective the CPR (Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation) is that the bystanders or "first responders" give.

We need these not only for our congregation, but also for the many groups of all ages that use our facilities.

These devices cost money, of course and lots of it. The AED cost, through a program courtesy of Avera Hospital system, is 1900 dollars per unit plus a few hundred for a cabinet to keep them in plain sight on a wall. This is a bargain.

The first step is to get the funding for the AED's. We are asking that the congregation donate any amount they are able toward this very worthwhile project. Donations can be dropped off at the office, or we'll have a basket at the back of the sanctuary on Sundays.
